The Provincial Grand Lodge of Ross and Cromarty

As this is the first edition of the Patter of 2025, can I, on behalf of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Ross and Cromarty, wish all our readers a very happy, healthy and prosperous year ahead.

Unfortunately, I must open on a sad note, as over the past three months this Province, and Freemasonry in general, has lost three huge characters.

In late November we heard that Brother Ian Fraser, Past First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Scotland had passed to the Grand Lodge above. Brother Ian was a tremendous and tireless ambassador for Royal Arch Freemasonry, both within Scotland and the many countries throughout the world that he visited. He was well loved and respected by all that he met, and many will fondly remember his wry sense of humour, his charismatic manner and relaxed approach to Freemasonry despite its sometimes rigorous and staid rituals.

Ian served as First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Scotland for nine years, from 2009 - 2018. He also served as Provincial Grand Master of Ross and Cromarty from 2001 - 2006 and was a Past Master of Lodge Averon No. 866.

The last time I met with Ian, along with the Grand Master Mason, Brother Ramsay McGhee, was to visit him in Raigmore Hospital to present him with his 60-year Jubilee certificate, a great achievement, and exceptional service to Scottish Freemasonry, served cheerfully with great honour and distinction.

Shortly later, in early December, we received the sad news that Brother Ian MacLaren, Past Provincial Grand Chaplain, had also laid down his working tools.

Brother Ian had bravely lived for the past several years with thrice weekly trips to Raigmore Hospital to receive dialysis treatment, but it did not stop him regularly attending meetings at his own Mother Lodge, Lodge Rosehaugh No. 1216, attending many other lodge meetings throughout the Province and a constant companion to Brother Ramsay McGhee during his travels throughout the length and breadth of Scotland fulfilling his various roles with the Grand Lodge of Scotland. During Ian's time spent with Ramsay, not only was a source of companionship, but he acted as navigator, keeping Ramsay on the correct route in their travels to many out of the way places, and affectionately earning himself the nickname of "Tom-Tom". During these extensive travels Ian made many friends, and gained the respect of many Brethren, who will sadly his miss his cheery banter.

I also remember the bravery and ingenuity of Ian when, during a fund-raising event that we planned for the Make It A Million appeal, we had arranged to cycle around all the Lodges in our Province. Not to be outdone, Ian had talked to the nursing staff at Raigmore Hospital about the event and his frustration at not being able to join in, and so captivated were the nurses with his disappointment, that they had arranged for an exercise bicycle to located in the dialysis ward so that he could cycle the equivalent miles whilst he was hooked up to his dialysis equipment receiving his treatment.

What an example of the mettle and fortitude of the man, and a great example to all his commitment to Freemasonry.

More recently, we were all shocked to hear of the sudden passing of Brother Jim Tait, Past Substitute Provincial Grand Master.

Brother Jim, despite his many other ailments, was a regular attender, and participant, at many lodges and events, not only in our Province, but throughout Scotland. Jim was a great supporter of the Provincial Grand Lodge and was outstanding in his commitment, support and attendance.

Jim was a member of many other masonic orders and regularly held office in every order that he supported.

He was well known for his entertaining skills and there was never a dull moment when Jim was in the company. His popularity was evident in the huge attendance at his funeral, with around 75 Brethren perambulating and marking the grave.

All three of these Brethren were great ambassadors for Highland Freemasonry and their passing leaves a great void in our Craft, but we can rejoice in the affability, that we have been blessed in that we have been fortunate to have shared some harmonious and cordial time with each of them and have the everlasting memories of great times spent together.

Our heartfelt condolences are tendered to their families and friends and let us offer our prayers for the Great Architect of the Universe to bless and keep the souls of our departed brethren into his eternal lodge above.

While $\pounds791$ per annum seems like a lot of money, our Treasurer has searched through cheaper solutions, finding mostly that their headline prices required increasing greatly to provide suitable cover, negating any pecuniary benefit.

Lodge Kyle benevolence was good this quarter with the Local Branch of Legion Scotland receiving £350 which includes another very generous donation from Janet Macpherson, daughter of the late PM Hector Macpherson, given in his memory. The Local swimming pool, The Lochalsh Leisure Centre, was also gifted £150 as their facility recently caught fire and the repairs are expected run into 6 figures. They had good insurance but continue to raise funds and we wish them well in their endeavours.

The Brethren are all optimistic that this year will be a good one and we benefit from several younger new members who keep the older Brethren on their toes to make it so! Several of the younger Brethren participate in The Young Masons, Meeting virtually (on Zoom) with other Young Masons across the country. This brings fresh ideas into the Lodge and adds knowledge and interest for new Brethren who are unfamiliar with our ritual and Freemasonry in general ... all from the comfort of their own home.

Lastly, may I take this opportunity to wish all the Brethren in the province, A Happy New Year with good health and prosperity in 2025!
